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### **Open Door Policy is BACK!**

Beginning in March, we will be allowing parents back in the building! We will email out a code for families to use at the front entrance to walk your student in the building and sign-in and sign-out.

Here are our expectations of students coming in with you. (Because this is what they have been doing for 2 years and the youngest of our students have been very successful with the independence and confidence this daily task provides.)

- Please have your child *walk* on their own into the building carrying their own belongings.
- Sign your child "IN" and "OUT" with the time and a FULL signature. Notebook located at desk area in the middle room.
- Please allow your child to put their own personal items into their cubby (with guidance if needed) so they know where it is and what it looks like. They can do that while you are signing in & out.
- Instruct and assist your child to wash their hands in the restroom (20 seconds) or middle classroom.

### **Enroll for Summer and Fall 2022!!**

With this newsletter, we will be including your intent to continue form for Summer and Fall 2022. We will have open enrollment for new students April 1st, so

it is important for us to know if your child will be here for our "Summer Exploration Series". If your child will not be attending this summer you need to fill out a withdrawal notice by May 1<sup>st</sup> to give your 30 days' notice and ensure that your deposit will be applied to your last month of tuition. Our summer session covers June & July. **We will also pro-rate August for anyone who will be starting at FUSD.** Foresight Fall session begins on Monday August 1st, 2022.
